## Ten Girl Scouts from Rockland County Earn Gold Award, the Highest Award in Girl Scouting

Their awards were presented during an ceremony and celebration June 3, 2023 at Camp Addisone Boyce in Tomkins Cove, NY.

When compared to non-Girl Scout alumnae, over ninety percent of Girl Scouts not only attributed their success in life to Girl Scouts, but they also said they could not have had access to the same experiences anywhere else.
