## Thirty-Five Girl Scouts from Westchester County Earn Gold Award, the Highest Award in Girl Scouting

Montgomery, NY (June 15, 2023) – Thirty-Five Girl Scouts from Westchester County, members of Girl Scouts Heart of the Hudson, Inc. council, earned the prestigious Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest national award a Girl Scout can earn. Their awards were presented during an ceremony and celebration June 3, 2023 at Camp Addisone Boyce in Tomkins Cove, NY.

"It is my honor and privilege to...celebrate the amazing accomplishments of these young women," said Helen Wronski, Interim CEO of Girl Scouts Heart of the Hudson, Inc. "Those who have earned their Gold Award have embraced the Girl Scout Promise and Law and have put these words into action. They are strong, courageous, and accomplished young women who are the heroes of today and the future leaders of tomorrow."

According to the Girl Scout Research Institute's (GSRI) report, *The Power of the Girl Scout Gold Award: Excellence in Leadership and Life*, Girl Scout Gold Award recipients receive greater lifetime benefits than their peers with regard to positive sense of self, life satisfaction, leadership, life success, community service, and civic engagement thanks to their experience in Girl Scouting.

When compared to non-Girl Scout alumnae, over ninety percent of Girl Scouts not only attributed their success in life to Girl Scouts, but they also said they could not have had access to the same experiences anywhere else.

This year's class of Gold Award Girl Scouts identified projects in their communities and created lasting and sustainable solutions to make them a better place. Projects focused on the keeping the Hudson River clean, addressing mental health in teens, providing resources for LGBTQ+ youth, support for those experiencing financial hardships, sensory programs, and more.
