

GSHH Program Centers and Houses

Whether you're looking for a place to have a troop meeting, or an easy comfortable space to have an overnight indoor experience, the following program centers and houses were designed with you and your girls in mind.

Betty Taubert Girl Scout House

**37 Wayside Lane
Scarsdale, NY 10583**

Named after Betty Taubert, a volunteer who worked tirelessly to advance Girl Scouting in Scarsdale, This house has 2 kitchens, a large meeting space with fireplace, and an overnight sleeping area. A caretaker lives on property.

- Overnight Capacity: 24 – downstairs only
- Day Capacity: 100 upstairs and 50 downstairs
- Parking: Unlimited
- Availability: The Village uses the building Monday – Friday 9am – 3pm. Girl Scouts are welcome to use the building any weekday after 3pm, for overnights, and/or on the weekends.

Crestwood Cabin

**360 Parkview Ave
Yonkers, NY 10710**

This year round cabin has a kitchen with appliances and a large meeting room.

- Overnight Capacity: 15-20
- Day Capacity: 40
- Parking: 6 cars
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, and weekends.

Fanny Fay House

**1 John Street
Beacon, NY 12508**

Named in memory of Fanny Fay Morrison, this house was originally built as a barracks by the Civilian Conservation Corp in the 1930's, and has been in our possession for over 70 years. This 4-room building has 2 meeting rooms, a kitchen with appliances as well as pots, pans, dishes, microwave, coffee pot, and a popcorn maker.

- Overnight Capacity: 22
- Day Capacity: 35 in the large meeting room; 15 in the small meeting room
- Parking: 5 cars in lot across the street
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends.

Larchmont House
90 Harmon Drive
Larchmont, NY 10538

Until 1938, this building served as the little brick railroad station for the “Bump and Wobble” or the Boston-Westchester commuter train. Since then, the Larchmont Girl Scout House has been well used by Girl Scouts. This space has one large meeting room, a large kitchen with appliances, and an indoor and outdoor fireplace.

- Overnight Capacity: 25-30
- Day Capacity: 60
- Parking: 10 cars
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends.

New Rochelle House
971 North Avenue
New Rochelle, NY 10801

This house was built by the Girl Scout community in 1951. It includes two large rooms with fireplaces (one on each floor), a kitchen with appliances, and a stage on the main level.

- Overnight Capacity: 30-35
- Day Capacity: 70
- Parking: 3 cars in driveway; street parking permitted
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends.

Pleasantville Program Center
2 Great Oak Lane
Pleasantville, NY 10570

Also used as the headquarters for Girl Scouts Heart of the Hudson, the Pleasantville Program Center has 13 offices, and a council shop in addition to 2 small kitchens, a stage, a meeting room, and a 4,500 sq. ft. gymnasium.

- Overnight Capacity: 24
- Day Capacity: 20 in meeting room; 90 (sitting) – 170 (standing) in gym
- Parking: 45 cars on site. Street parking is available, however, the village requests that we use the nearby public lots for additional parking.
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends, when not in use for Cookie Season or Council Programs.

Port Chester House
64 Parkway Drive
Port Chester, NY 10573

The Port Chester House has a large room with fireplace and kitchen with appliances upstairs, and a large meeting room downstairs.

- Overnight Capacity: 25-30
- Day Capacity: 60 on each level
- Parking: Street parking only
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends.

Rumsey Road
350 Rumsey Road
Yonkers, NY 10705

This Girl Scout space was acquired with the profits from the sale of Girl Scout cookies, and was opened in 1961. There is a meeting room and kitchen with appliances. There is a tenant in resident in an apartment connected to the house.

- Overnight Capacity: 20
- Day Capacity: 50
- Parking: 2 cars
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends.

Tuckahoe Eastchester Program Center
119 Highland Avenue
Eastchester, NY 10709

Built in 1958, this house was made possible by the profits from Girl Scout cookies. Tuck-East has meeting spaces on booth floors, kitchen facilities with appliances, two fireplaces, and a downstairs stage. The outdoor steps are similar to the "Singing Steps" at Edith Macy National Conference Center. In the summer, it is the site of Rocky Brook Day Camp.

- Overnight Capacity: 24
- Day Capacity: 50 on each floor
- Parking: 15 cars
- Availability: year-round for meetings, trainings, programs, overnights, or weekends. Not available during summer camp season.
