A Juliette is also known as Individually Registered Girl (IRG). Juliettes were named after our founder, Juliette Gordon Low.

The Juliette program is available to all girls in Kindergarten through 12th grade. It is especially popular for girls ages 11-17 who love the Girl Scout program but are very busy with other activities.





Juliettes can participate in everything that is open to their grade level.

They can attend Council-sponsored programs such as events, series opportunities, year-round camp experiences, and travel opportunities.

They can also take part in Council-sponsored money earning activities to help pay for Girl Scout events.



# Activities might include:

**Badge earning activities:** Girl Scout badges are a great way for girls to display their interests and new skills—and to remember every adventure by proudly wearing them on their uniforms as they show the world what they’ve accomplished.

**Fall Product & Girl Scout Cookie Program:** In addition to honing entrepreneurial skills Juliettes have the opportunity to set goals and earn start-up funds for Girl Scout activities, community service, or take action projects.

**Outings:** Girls learn by doing and getting out into the world around them. Outings might include visiting a business, going on a camp-out and hike, or even practicing life skills at a restaurant.

**Travel:** In Girl Scouting, travel presents girls the opportunity to learn about themselves, other cultures, new places, and the outdoors as they prepare, plan, and budget for their trip.

**A weekend or week at Camp:** Enjoy Girl Scout camp activities, like archery, canoeing, hiking, and more.

**Community Service and Take Action Projects:** Whether it’s through planting a garden, painting a mural, or launching a letter-writing campaign, she’ll make the world a better place.

**Bridging Events:** When Girl Scouts advance to the next Girl Scout level, they cross a bridge to symbolize a connection between her past Girl Scout experience and her future Girl Scout adventures. They can bridge with their caregiver, their Service Unit, or with Council.



Juliettes can get started right away by earning badges independently or attending events to meet other Girl Scouts in their area.





# Transitioning Membership

- Girls can transition from Juliettes into a troop or vice versa at any time within the membership year (October 1 – September 30).
- Girls only register (pay membership dues) once a year.

You can help your daughter in some simple but important ways:

- Ask her about her personal and troop cookie sale goals
- Listen to her plans for managing “her” cookie business
- Talk to her about what she learned each day
- Encourage her along the way, especially if she is disappointed
- Most of all, have fun with her!

All of the proceeds from the Girl Scout Cookie Program stay within our local areas. Girls benefit from the cookie profits they earn in many ways. Just as an example, a girl's “Dough Si Dough” can be used to pay for Girl Scout programs, annual membership fee, camp and more.

Girls are not required to participate in any activity. It is the sole discretion of each individual family and their comfort level with the planned activity.

Juliettes have two options for participating in our Product Sale Programs. They can participate online and/or in person, including a booth sale for the cookie sale.

# Cookie Sales

If the Juliette wishes to have a booth sale for the cookie program, first you must secure the location. Next, reach out to the Product Sales Department at Council ([productsales@girlscoutshh.org](mailto:productsales@girlscoutshh.org)) for assistance in scheduling the booth sale and acquiring a Certificate of Insurance for the sale. An adult must be present at the booth sale.

The caregiver will order and sign for cookies to be picked up at the Cookie Cupboard.

Cookies will be picked up from the Council Cupboard at the GSHH location most convenient to the Juliette. Our Product Sales Manager (PSM) can help estimate how many cookies should be purchased for the sale. **Unsold cookies cannot be returned, and payment will be required when cookies are picked up, so it is important to work out these details beforehand. Caregivers can contact the PSM to reorder whenever additional cookies are needed for their sale.**



## Juliette Product Sales Profits

*Profit from product sales cannot become the property of an individual girl member.*

As a result, Council will hold funds usually designated as “troop profit” and earned by a Juliette through her participation in the Product Sales Programs, in a restricted Juliette account. The Juliette can request the use of these funds for GSHH-approved activities using the Juliette Custodial Fund Application (<https://www.girlscoutshh.org/content/dam/girlscoutshh-redesign/documents/Custodial%20Fund%20Application1.pdf>).

These funds will expire 3 years from the date earned.





## Juliette Product Sales Profits


*A Juliette may use her Product Sales funds for any of the following:*

- *GSHH program activities.*
- *Community events or camping.*
- *GSUSA-sponsored program events.*
- *Adult chaperone fees for events/trips (one adult per Juliette).*
- *Earned awards.*
- *GSHH summer camp.*
- *Events/programs/summer camp at another Girl Scout council.*
- *Costs associated with achievement of the Silver and/or Gold award.*
- *Other items that a troop might purchase for its girl members.*
